### Membership of BAOMS

Medical and dental practitioners with an interest in oral and maxillofacial surgery are invited to apply for Membership. Members will receive the journal, notification of the activities of the association, and the opportunity to attend meetings of BAOMS. The current subscription is £85 per annum.

### Applying for and Retaining BAOMS Student and BAOMS Student Associate Status

Members of the Association are eligible to apply for BAOMS Student status. This category of membership is available to Members based in the UK who have taken their dental degree and are studying for a medical degree (MBBS), or who have taken their medical degree and are studying for a dental degree (BDS). Please note that Members whose subscriptions are in arrears are not eligible to apply for Student status.

Members of the Association should apply for Student status by contacting the BAOMS office, enclosing a letter from their Tutor or Head of Department confirming the starting date and anticipated end date of their studies. Applicants for BAOMS Membership who have already commenced their second degree studies can apply for Student status immediately. Membership applications must be accompanied by a letter from their Tutor or Head of Department confirming the start date and anticipated end date of their course in order for their fees to be waived from the commencement of their membership.

BAOMS Students are eligible for concessions when attending the Association's annual scientific meetings and can also apply for BAOMS Student Bursaries. Guidance notes and application forms are circulated to all BAOMS Students.

Every year the Association contacts all registered BAOMS Students from the previous year together with Members who have applied for Student status asking them to confirm their continuing studies. On receipt of this confirmation (the deadline is usually mid-May), applicants are approved for Student status, and their fees are waived for the coming year (1st July to 30th June). Any BAOMS Student or applicant for Student status who does not return the confirmation form by the deadline will be invoiced for the appropriate membership fee in the coming year.

The newly membership category of BAOMS Member with Student Associate status has been created for those with an interest in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery whilst they are engaged in full-time studies relating to the specialty (usually a dental or medical degree) but who do not yet have registration with either the GMC or the GDC, which is a requirement for all UK-based Members.

Applicants for Student Associate status will be required to provide proof of their full time studies when they apply, in the form of a signed letter from a Tutor / Head of Department confirming the start and anticipated end date of their course.

Members with Student Associate status will be eligible to have their annual subscription waived for each full year of their studies, and will also be eligible to attend Annual Scientific Meetings at the same subsidised rates as Members with BAOMS Student status.

Each year BAOMS will contact all Student Associates asking them to confirm their continuing eligibility. On receipt of this confirmation (the deadline is usually mid-May) their annual subscription will be waived for the coming year. Student Associates who do not return the confirmation will have all membership services suspended and their membership cancelled at the end of the membership year.

As soon as a Student Associate concludes his or her full-time studies and/or becomes registered with the GDC or GMC he or she will be eligible to for Membership and can revert to this category upon payment of the appropriate subscription rate.

### Ethicon Foundation Fund

The Fund was endowed by Ethicon Ltd. with the aim of promoting international goodwill in surgery, by providing financial assistance towards travel abroad.

Grants are made from the Fund, in accordance with the stated aim, to Fellows of The Royal College of Surgeons of England who are proposing to travel abroad for research or training purposes or, exceptionally, to teach. Applicants must be Fellows of The Royal College of Surgeons. The grant is awarded twice yearly.

undertake a research or educational project in the UK. The prize is awarded annually.

Candidates should be Fellows of the Royal College of Surgeons of England between the ages of 30 and 36 years.

### **Mechanism for Appointment of Examiners for the Intercollegiate Examination in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery**

Fellow's attention should be drawn to the mechanism for the appointment of examiners for the Intercollegiate Examination in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, agreed by the Joint Committee for Intercollegiate Examinations and approved by Senate. Examiners shall normally be appointed for a maximum period of 5 years and shall retire from duty on reaching the age of 65 years or ceasing clinical practice. There will be an annual advertisement in the journals of the Royal Surgical Colleges but not in the specialist journals.

Applications will be considered by the individual Intercollegiate Boards according to criteria recommended by Senate and an annual list of the panel of examiners,

including new nominations from the Boards, has to be approved by Senate.

### **IADR/AADR Research Awards**

The Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Research Group Awards (OMFSRG, a component of the International Association for Dental Research/ American Association for Dental Research, IADR/AADR), recognize outstanding research contributions and promote excellence in oral and maxillofacial surgery-related research.

The members of the OMFSRG Awards Committee select the award winner based only on the scientific merit of the abstract and presentation. All presentations are scored using a rigorous set of criteria including originality, research methodology, scientific merit, and relevance of the research.

Below is a brief description of the various awards given by OMFSRG.

1. The Leibinger Prize for Facial Injury Research (\$2000) is given to the lead investigator of the highest scored oral/poster presentation on oral and maxillofacial trauma (physical, biomechanical, social, biobehavioral, or health services research) at the annual IADR/AADR meeting.
2. The KLS Martin Prize for Distraction Osteogenesis/Orthognathic Surgery Research (\$2000) is given to the lead investigator of the highest scored oral/poster presentation on the theme of distraction

osteogenesis/orthognathic surgery (basic or clinical research) at the annual IADR/AADR meeting.

3. The Sulzer–Calcitek Prize for Dental Implant Research (\$2000) is given to the lead investigator of the highest scored oral/poster presentation on the theme of dental implants and orofacial reconstruction (basic or clinical research) at the annual IADR/AADR meeting.
